Read & Approve Prior Minutes: Motion to approve the minutes from FOJBE PTO meeting held on December 6, 2019 was made by Kathy Waller and the Motion was seconded by Mary Lauren Eubank. The Motion passed without objection.

Report of the Executive Board:

- A. Presidents' Report: Jaime Shachter gave a brief report.
 - 1. Request was made for members to participate on the PTO Board Slating Committee. The board requires at least 3 people. The board will first be asking the existing board if they wish to continue on for the 2020-2021 school year.
 - a. Amee Bailey & Jaime Shachter volunteered to be on the committee.
 - 2. In attempt to re-energize JBE sense of community, PTO is attempting to host a "park and play" on early release Wednesdays. Parents will pick up students through the carline as usual, then convene at the playground, allowing parents the ability to interact and socialize with other parents. This will be advertised on Facebook the Monday & Tuesday prior as well as on the carline sandwich board. PTO will have current volunteer needs available for sign-up on site. This still needs approval from Ms. Mattingly.
 - 3. PTO is finding ways to incentivize volunteers. Possibilities include having premier parking for big events as well as spotlighting the volunteer of the month on Facebook.
 - 4. We will begin scaling back on homeroom parent requirements:
 - a. Kindness Meals for teachers will be eliminated. However, if a grade level wants to continue and can support the meal, it will be scheduled.

- b. Wellness parents will have only 1 lesson per month. Targeted and accessible lessons will be planned.
- c. Art lessons for art enrichments parents will be changed from monthly to quarterly, particularly amongst the upper grades.
- 5. The following programs will possibly be cut from next school year due to the lack of volunteers: Family Dinner Night, Talent Show, Invention Convention, Donuts with Dad, Mornings with Mom
- 6. The following changes will be possibly be made for the 20-21 School year:
 - a. Volunteer Signups on Cheddar Up will be eliminated, they have not been effective in obtaining volunteers for programs.
 - b. The PTO Board will determine which events will utilize internal vs. external volunteers (parent volunteers vs. youth MS/HS volunteers). For example, Monster Mash & Science Night will rely on youth volunteers from MS & HS, allowing parents to attend and enjoy certain programs.
 - c. Potential larger events will be adopted and planned by grade level.
 - d. Improvements will be made on obtaining class email contact lists. Parents will be able to "opt-in" for communication at orientation (day one).

- 2. Parent Bullying Seminar @ JBE, January 15th, 9:00 AM. This is open to anyone and everyone. The seminar will address the following: what to do in the event that your child has been bullied, strategies for bullies to stop bullying and will outline what DCPS defines as bullying.
- 3. Teacher of the Year will be recognized at the DCPS banquet next Friday, January 17th.
- 4. Literacy Week will be held from Monday, January 27th to Friday, January 31st. The theme is "Book Your Trip!: Adventure Awaits!"

C. Teacher Representative: Ms. Brothers.

- 1. New program Freckle (Reading, Math, Science and Social Studies) is being implemented as a pilot program for 60 days. This software requires the need of classroom technology. Teachers have 6 computers per classroom. Computer ratio: 1-1.75, there are about 300 computers in the building.
